## Child Abuse Investigation Protocol Multi Disciplinary Team Approach

The student will learn the accepted protocol while investigating child abuse cases in conjunction with other non-law enforcement agencies, such as the Children's Protective Services, the Child Advocacy Center, District Attorney's Office, medical professional and therapists. The student will have a better understanding of the cooperative effort needed to effectively gather and share facts of the case with other professionals who provide services for victims of child abuse. While certain aspects of this class will address the specific cooperative agreement established in Galveston County, the overall protocol in general will present the standard multi disciplinary team concept of investigating these types of cases. This course has been designed to help the newest and most experienced officers have a better understanding of the entire process, legislative updates and procedural changes. 4 hrs of TCLEOSE credit will be given.
